### Her Roots Run Deep

#### \*Uvira II — 5th dam

he Aga Khan III established the 20th century's most influential stud farm in the 1920s by buying the best yearlings on the market, including the toppriced fillies Teresina and Mumtaz Mahal, both of whom became top-class runners and established enduring female lines. The Aga Khan followed the dictum of Lord Falmouth, the most successful English classic breeder of the 19th century, by breeding primarily from high-class two-year-olds fillies. His purchase of the good two-year-old, Lady Lawless, for \$28,000 in 1923, earned fewer immediate dividends for the Aga Khan Studs, but an equal bonanza for countless other great breeders. The Aga Khan sold Lady Lawless's best daughter, \*Uvira II, to the Vicomte de Fontarce when the Indian potentate was trapped in Switzerland during World War II and in need of funds. \*Uvira II won the 1941 Irish Oaks by six lengths and then was sold to Texas oilman, Emmerson J. Woodward, and imported to America. A.B. "Bull" Hancock, Jr. paid a then world record price of \$61,000 in 1949 on behalf of John S. Phipps, brother of Wheatley Stable's Henry C. Phipps and uncle of Ogden Phipps. \*Uvira II had already bred three stakes winners and she produced two more for John Phipps and his son and heir Micahel Phipps.

\*Uvira II's daughters established thriving families that include luminaries like Lawyer Ron, First Dude, Ski Paradise, and Iron Ruler, but Bouquet Booth's fourth dam, Missy Baba, founded one of the best families in the contemporary stud book.

#### Missy Baba — 4th dam

Through her sire, \*My Babu, and dam, \*Uvira II, Missy Baba's pedigree combined the bloodlines of the greatest French breeder of the 20th century, Marcel Boussac, and those of the greatest English breeder of the century, the Aga Khan. Missy Baba did not achieve much on the racetrack, winning only a maiden race from seven starts, but her uniquely valuable combination of bloodlines bore fruit at stud, where she equalled her dam's record of five stakes winners, best of whom was Grade 1 winner Sauce Boat, by Key to the Mint. Missy Baba's stakes winning son, Raja Baba, initiated the family's connection with Lane's End when William S. Farish, founder of the early 21st century's most influential nursery, purchased the son of Bold Ruler for stud duty. Raja Baba became leading sire in 1980, but by that time Farish and partner William S. Kilroy had purchased Missy Baba's granddaughter, Lassie Dear, by the great racehorse, sire, and broodmare sire Buckpasser, out of Missy Baba's stakes winning daughter, Gay Missile, by Sir Gaylord. Farish and partners bred A.P. Indy, Summer Squall, Lemon Drop Kid, and Court Vision from Lassie Dear's family.

#### Toll Booth — 3rd dam

Mike Phipps sold Missy Baba to New York financier John M. Schiff in 1970, making Schiff the breeder of the great mare's last daughter Toll Booth. Winner of 3 of 22 starts, Toll Booth became the most prolific broodmare yet from this great family, producing seven stakes winners from 13 foals for the Fox Ridge Farm of John Schiff and his son Peter, and earning Broodmare of the Year honors in 1991. Toll Booth's best son Plugged Nickle, by Key to the Mint, earned champion sprinter honors in 1980, and her best daughter, Christiecat, by Majestic Light, won the '91 Flower Bowl Handicap (G1) and produced Japanese millionaire Excuse, by Boston Harbor. Other daughters and granddaughters of Toll Booth have produced graded stakes winners Solvig, Token Dance, Gator Dancer, Lady Carlock, Islefaxyou, Wortheroatsingold, and Daylight Savings.

#### Toll Fee — 2nd dam

Toll Fee, by Northern Dancer's sprinting son Topsider, has become by far the most important daughter of Toll Booth at stud. Winner of 7 of 33 starts and \$333,917, including the Weber City Miss Stakes, Toll Fee produced graded stakes placed The Bink, by Seeking the Gold. The Bink is dam of multiple Grade 1 winner Riskaverse, by Dynaformer, who earned \$2.1-million, as well as Grade 3 winner Cozzy Corner. Toll Fee's winning daughter Easter Bunnette, by Carson City, is dam of 2011 Horse of the Year and champion older mare Havre de Grace, by Saint Liam, earner of more than \$2.5-million. Another daughter Rahfee, by Rahy, is dam of graded winner Tasteyville, by With Approval.

#### Toll Order — 1st dam

By the beautifully bred French highweight and Group 1 winner Loup Sauvage, Bouquet Booth's dam Toll Order did not excel on the racecourse, but she is well on her way to upholding her family's magnificent heritage. Toll Order followed the tradition of her family by producing the high-class two-year-old Bouquet Booth, winner of three of her four starts at two in 2010. Bouquet Booth confirmed her class at three by winning the Silverbulletday Stakes at Fair Grounds.

Bouquet Booth is from the first crop of 2005 Travers Stakes (G1) winner Flower Alley, the first top-class son of the great sire Distorted Humor to go to stud. Flower

Flower Alley confirmed his ability by siring 2011 Kentucky Derby (G1) and Preakness Stakes (G1) and likely 3-year-old champion I'll Have Another in his second crop. As Joe Estes proved in the 1930s, high-class racemares produce about eight times as many stakes winners, by percentage, as ordinary mares, and as Lord Falmouth, the Aga Khan, and countless other great breeders have learned, precocious two-year-olds increase the odds of high-class production. Bouquet Booth combines those characteristics with the blood of champions produced by the greatest breeders of the 20th and 21st centuries.


