THE Delaware

CERTIFIED ADVANTAGE

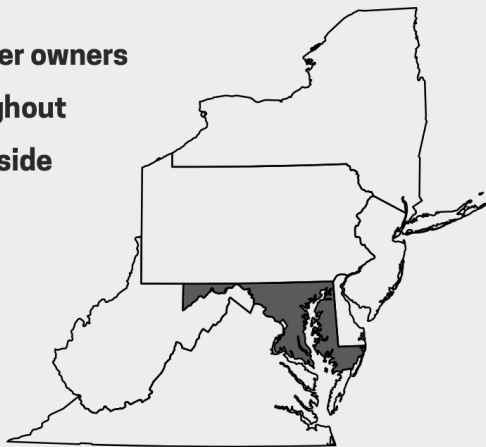
**Yearlings bred in any state can become
Delaware Certified and earn valuable
advantages at Delaware Park.**



- Certification requires 90 consecutive days of Delaware residency during the weanling or yearling year.
- Delaware Certified horses receive entry preference at Delaware Park.
- Owners can earn a 25% purse bonus for first-, second-, and third-place finishes, subject to a \$7,500 maximum per horse per race.
- Certifiers can earn a separate 25% bonus on those same finishes, also subject to the program maximum.
- Delaware Certified horses are eligible for eight restricted stakes offered from July through September.

THE Maryland Bred ADVANTAGE

Horses bred in Maryland offer owners added earning power throughout their racing careers, both inside and outside the state.

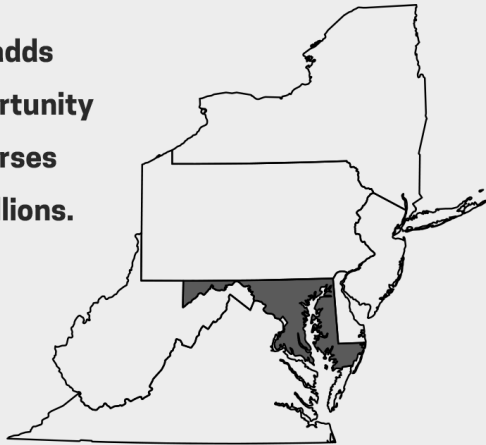


- Owners receive a 15% bonus when a registered Maryland-bred finishes first- through third-place in qualifying open overnight races in Maryland.
- The owner at the time of the horse's career debut may qualify as its developer and earn a separate 15% bonus throughout the horse's racing career.
- Maryland-sired maiden winners can earn an additional 5% owner bonus.
- During Maryland's summer hiatus, qualifying Maryland-breds can earn bonuses at Colonial Downs and Delaware Park.
- Registered Maryland-breds are supported by substantial breeder awards, helping strengthen their demand and long-term commercial value.

THE Maryland Million ADVANTAGE

Maryland Million eligibility adds another level of racing opportunity and earning potential for horses by nominated Maryland stallions.

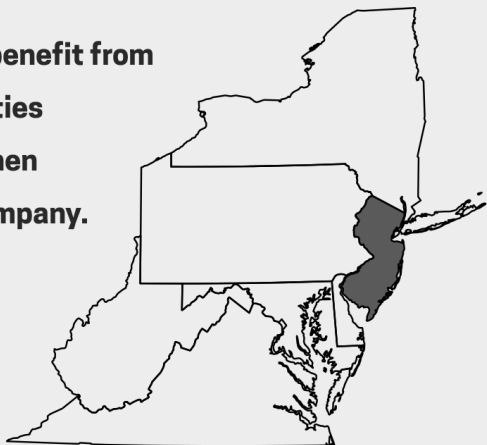


- Maryland Million Day at Laurel Park offers more than \$1 million annually in purses and awards for eligible horses.
- The program provides restricted opportunities across multiple ages, distances, and racing divisions.
- Beginning in 2026, an eligible horse that wins a maiden race in Maryland earns a 5% bonus on the winner's share of the base purse.
- Maryland Million-eligible horses can receive preference and compete for additional bonus money in designated races offered during the year.
- There is no nomination fee for eligible foals.
- The program continues to expand beyond Maryland Million Day, creating additional opportunities for eligible horses throughout their racing careers.

THE New Jersey Bred ADVANTAGE

Horses bred in New Jersey benefit from restricted racing opportunities and substantial bonuses when competing against open company.

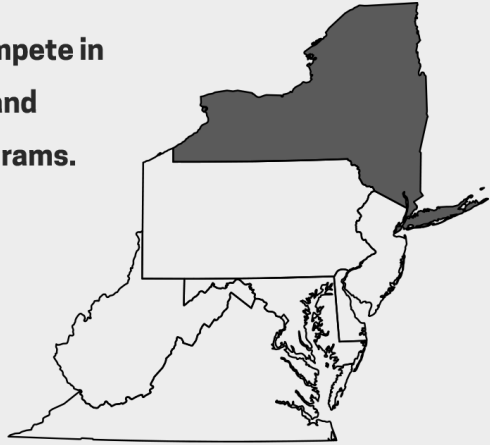


- At least one New Jersey-bred restricted race is offered each day at Monmouth Park and the Meadowlands.
- Restricted New Jersey-bred races offer purses 25% higher than corresponding open races.
- Owners can earn a 40% bonus when a New Jersey-bred finishes first- through third-place in an open company race in New Jersey subject to a \$15,000 maximum per race.
- Registered New Jersey-breds also generate breeder and stallion awards when competing in the state.
- The program has proven it can produce horses of national quality, led by 2025 Eclipse Champion Male Sprinter Book'em Danno.

THE New York Bred ADVANTAGE

Horses bred in New York compete in one of the nation's richest and most diverse incentive programs.



- More than \$60 million annually in purses, awards, and incentives.
- New York-bred races on the NYRA circuit offer purses equal to comparable open company races.
- Restricted overnight races at Belmont Park and Saratoga receive enhanced purses.
- Eligibility for the \$3.2 million Empire Trillium Series at Belmont Park and Woodbine.
- Eligible horses by New York stallions may compete in the \$2.3 million New York Stallion Stakes Series.
- Year-round racing opportunities, including winter racing on the synthetic surface at Belmont Park.
- Owner awards are available when registered New York-breds finish first- through third-place in qualifying open company races in New York.

THE Pennsylvania Bred ADVANTAGE

**Pennsylvania offers year-round racing,
valuable owner bonuses, and an
extensive stakes program for
horses bred in the state.**

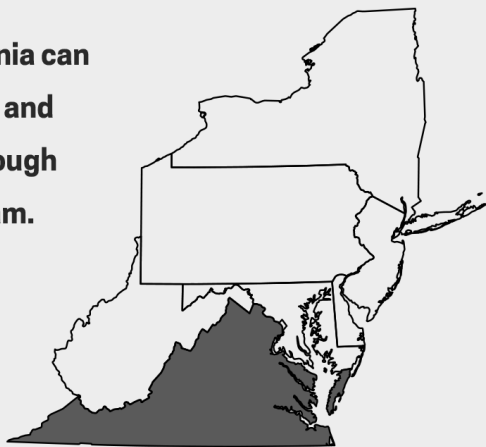


- Approximately 331 racing days annually among Parx Racing, Penn National, and Presque Isle Downs.
- Owner bonuses of 40% at Parx, 30% at Presque Isle, and 25% at Penn National.
- Twenty Pennsylvania-bred stakes worth a combined \$1.7 million in 2026.
- Pennsylvania's Day at the Races offers more than \$1 million in purses and awards exclusively for Pennsylvania-breds.
- Pennsylvania-breds also generate significant breeder and stallion awards, adding to their commercial appeal.
- Awards and incentives totaled \$23 million in 2025.

THE Virginia — CERTIFIED ADVANTAGE —

Yearlings bred outside Virginia can qualify for additional racing and incentive opportunities through the Virginia Certified Program.

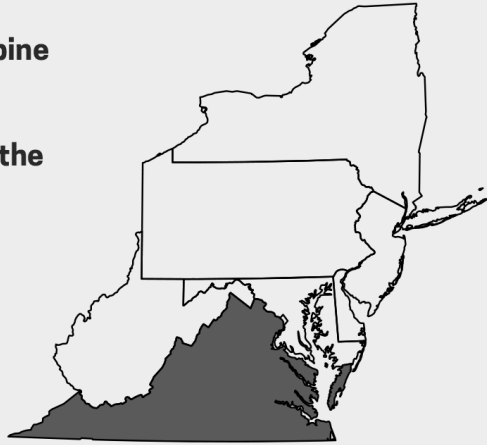


- Certification requires the horse to reside in Virginia for six months before December 31 of its two-year-old year.
- Virginia Certified horses are eligible for restricted races offering purses 25% higher than comparable open races.
- The developer can earn a 10% bonus in qualifying state-restricted races.
- Developer bonuses of up to 25% are available for qualifying open company wins in New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, and Virginia.
- During the Colonial Downs meet, owner and developer bonuses are not earned for wins at other racetracks.

THE Virginia Bred ADVANTAGE

Horses bred in Virginia combine lucrative restricted racing opportunities with some of the strongest open-company bonuses in the region.



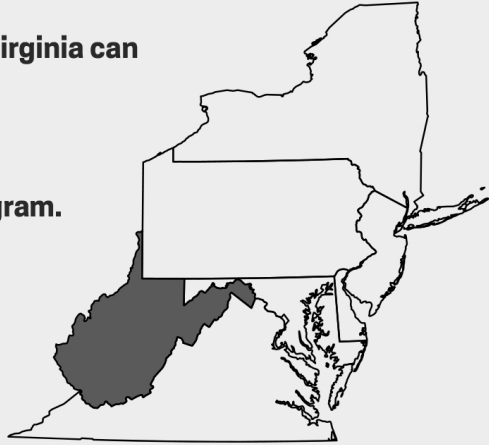
- Owners earn a 50% purse bonus when a Virginia-bred finishes first- through fourth-place in an open race at Colonial Downs.
- Virginia-breds are eligible for restricted races at Colonial Downs and designated state-bred stakes in both Virginia and Maryland.
- The developer of a Virginia-bred can earn a 10% bonus in qualifying state-restricted races.
- Developer bonuses of up to 25% are available for qualifying open company wins in New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, and Virginia.
- Virginia-bred status also creates breeder awards when the horse performs successfully in qualifying races throughout North America.

THE West Virginia

— CERTIFIED ADVANTAGE —

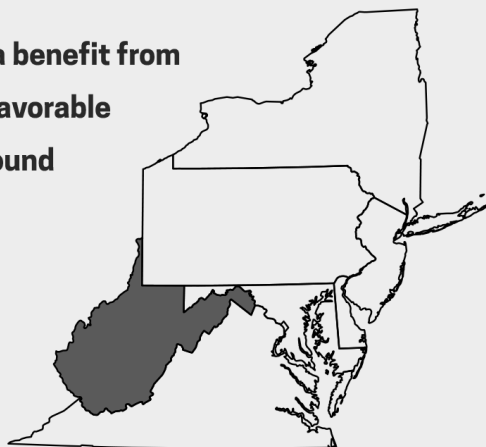
Horses bred outside West Virginia can qualify for additional racing opportunities through the West Virginia Certified Program.



- Certification requires the horse to reside in West Virginia for six consecutive months before January 1 of its three-year-old year.
- West Virginia Certified horses may compete in restricted races at both Charles Town and Mountaineer.
- Certified horses are not eligible for West Virginia accredited stakes or the West Virginia Breeders Classics.

THE West Virginia Bred ADVANTAGE

Horses bred in West Virginia benefit from frequent restricted races, favorable race conditions, and year-round earning opportunities.



- Up to three West Virginia restricted races may be offered on a single race card.
- West Virginia-breds qualify under both West Virginia and open conditions, providing additional opportunities to enter and win.
- Approximately 165 racing days are offered annually.
- Eligible West Virginia-breds participate in the West Virginia Development Fund.
- Accredited West Virginia-breds may compete in the state's restricted stakes program and the West Virginia Breeders Classics.
